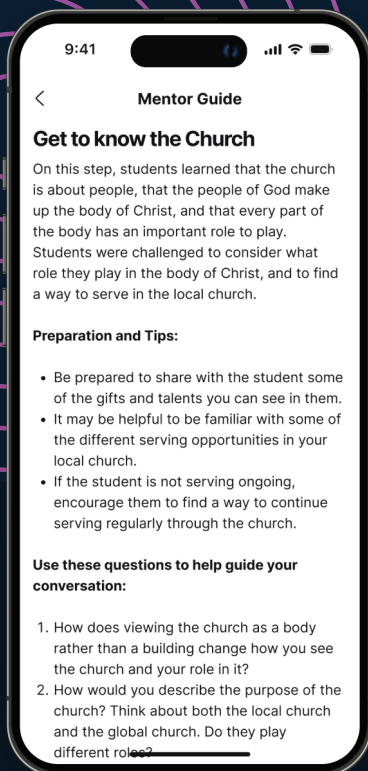


The Follow Through App

The Follow Through app provides next steps for students called into vocational ministry. It exists to make sure that no student feels stuck in their decision, but supported, equipped, and encouraged to actually follow through.

While the app is a tool to provide helpful structure, it's not the most important part of the process—you are!

When leaders follow up, students follow through



Each student in Follow Through will invite a mentor to walk alongside them. If you choose to fill that role, you will become a source of encouragement, prayer, and consistency throughout the student's journey.

This personal connection makes all the difference. The app helps organize the path, but it's the trusted voice of a mentor that helps a student stay the course.

What is a mentor?

A Follow Through Mentor is a trusted adult who walks with a student as they explore a potential calling into vocational ministry. You do not need to be a pastor, teacher, or Bible expert — only someone who loves students and is passionate about helping them grow in their faith and follow God's call.

Mentors are not expected to lead the student's journey, but to support it. Your role is to listen, encourage, pray, and be present. **Mentor Guides will equip you for each conversation based on the student's current step, so all you need to do is show up and be an encouragement.**

What's Expected?

- Pray for your student(s) as they discern God's calling for their life
- Check-in often to encourage your student(s) to keep going
- Meet with your student(s) on a regular basis as they complete steps in Follow Through



How to Get Started

1

Say yes when a student reaches out and asks for mentorship. They will need either your phone number or email address to send you an invite.

2

Download the app and log in. Once the student has sent an invite, you'll be prompted in the app to accept. Note that students will not be able to complete their first step until you have accepted the invite, so don't wait on this!

3

Schedule your first meeting with the student! Meet in person, at a coffee shop, on a video call, playing Minecraft, or whatever works for you! The important thing is to meet regularly and check in often.
